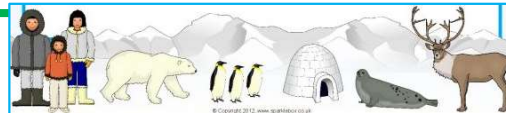


Big Question: How has Polar Exploration changed from the past?

Key Vocabulary

Significant	Important and worth knowing about.
Explorer	An explorer is someone who goes on an exploration.
Exploration	A journey where explorers travel to unfamiliar places.
Polar	Used when talking about anything to do with the North Pole or the South Pole.
Equipment	Things which are used for a particular purpose, for example a hobby or job
Commemorate	To celebrate and remember a person or event.
Recent	In the past but not long ago. <i>We are working within a 100 year timeline in this topic.</i>

Significant Polar Explorers		Timeline
	<p>Matthew Henson</p> <p><u>Famous exploration:</u> 1909</p> <p><u>Where:</u> Arctic</p> <p><u>Famous for:</u> Being part of the group to first get to the Arctic, overlooked and forgotten for being black</p>	1909
	<p>Robert Falcon Scott/ Scott of the Antarctic</p> <p><u>Famous exploration:</u> 1910-1912</p> <p><u>Where:</u> Antarctica</p> <p><u>Famous for:</u> Being beaten to the South Pole by the Norwegians and then not making it home</p>	1910-1912
	<p>Felicity Aston</p> <p><u>Famous Exploration:</u> 2012</p> <p><u>Where:</u> Antarctica</p> <p><u>Famous for:</u> First female to travel alone to Antarctica, journey completed on ski's</p>	2012

Past Knowledge: Polar Regions

- Arctic = North Pole Antarctic = South Pole
- Animals and people live in the Arctic
- Antarctica does not have any permanent human habitation
- The Polar Regions are cold places, covered in ice and snow.
