### Diversity Week and Courageous Advocacy

The whole school took part in a themed week all about CELEBRATING DIVERSITY.

Each class took a separate area of diversity to learn about. This included disability, diversity in relationships and diversity in culture.

Over the week we had music workshops from different cultures, we baked Rainbow cakes, the children played blind cricket to really gain an understanding of what it is to have a disability. Over the week the classes presented what they had learnt within their areas of diversity to the whole school.

Class 2 have taken this a step further ,showing courageous advocacy when joining with Ripon Disability Forum. Following a presentation given to them by Jem Dunford of the RDF, the children completed a village survey aimed at highlighting how accessible our village is. The results were very positive for our village with the exception of a missing 'dropped curb'. This has been bought to the attention of the council and there are plans to rectify this in the future.
